<p><b>Positive Health Project (PHP)</b>            301 West 37th Street, 3rd Floor            New York, NY 10018            (Syringe Exchange Program)</p>	<p>PHP works with several pharmacies throughout Manhattan to educate them about ESAP and establish a link with PHP's SEP. When a client comes into the pharmacy to buy syringes, the pharmacists provide them with a fit pack, and with information about returning them to PHP's SEP.</p> <p>An ESAP-registered provider in collaboration with PHP furnishes syringes from PHP's Mobile Outreach Van at different locations throughout Harlem and Washington Heights. BATF has partnered with pharmacies and provides them with education and fitpacks.            2. Two of their sites are registered as alternative collection sites: 2225 Church Avenue site and 502 Bergen Street site. Syringe disposal hours: M - F 9 AM to 5 PM.            3. Through SIBRO, furnishing of syringes occur at the 502 Bergen Street Site. (See SIBRO)            4. Additionally, an ESAP registered provider, in collaboration with BATF, furnishes syringes from their mobile van. The ESAP provider works five hours a day, Monday through Thursday. CitiWide Works' staff educate all individuals in need of syringe disposal regarding safety precautions for carrying and handling injection equipment and distribute fitpacks.            2. An ESAP registered provider, in collaboration with CitiWide, furnishes syringes from a van or while walking around the van area. SIBRO is a consortium of health care practitioners in private practice and in community-based organizations in SI and Brooklyn. They have registered as ESAP Providers to furnish syringes. Dr. Glaser's private practice was the first site where furnishing was established in July 2005. In April 2006, the demo project was expanded to include: DOMI/Turning Point (zip code 11220), BATF (zip code 11217), and Project Hospitality (10301 &amp; 10304).</p> <p>2. Clients were referred to the George Washington Bridge Outreach Program for drug treatment, shelters, drop-in centers, clothing distribution, food pantries and soup kitchens. A short in-take is completed and if client is in need of a service, the client is escorted to the service on the spot. 2. A kiosk has been placed in the lobby at the 119 west 24th Street entrance.</p>

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<p><b>Catholic Charities AIDS Services</b> 326 Clinton Avenue Albany, NY 12206</p>	<p>Project Safe Point is a new prevention initiative that contains three components.</p> <p>Catholic Charities AIDS Services has been partnering with Centro Civico of Amsterdam through their Project Needle Smart program since 2006 to increase access to syringe disposal sites in Albany and Schenecdaty.Project Needle Smart is supervising two disposal kiosks for project Safe Point.</p> <p>A second component of Project Safe Point is syringe access, implemented in October 2007. The goal of the service is to increase access to clean syringes in our communities by removing the barrier of cost for participants. Vouchers are distributed to area agencies which might have contact with IV drug users and other individuals that use needles for a range of medications. Once distributed to potential participants, the vouchers may be taken to a participating pharmacy and redeemed for 10 clean syringes and HIV prevention materials.</p> <p>The final component of the program is in development, to implement a mobile Syringe Exchange Program in targeted neighborhoods to provide access to syringes, HIV/Hepatitis/STD testing and health assessments.</p>

The ESAP registered providers at ASC furnishes syringes once a week, Tuesdays, 3 PM to 6 PM.</li> <li>2. The agency has placed a kiosk in the lobby/waiting area.</li> </ol>
<p><b>Erie County Dept. of Health</b> 95 Franklin Street Buffalo 14202</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The Syringe Expanded Access and Disposal (SEAD) Project is an educational/action program which targets the communities in the eight counties of Western New York. The program focuses in providing information regarding legal access to new, clean syringes without a prescription and appropriate avenues of disposal of used syringes, needles and lancets.</li> <li>2. A collaboration exists between the local DOH, State DOH, Stericycle, AIDS Community Services of WNY, the WNY Coalition for Diabetes Prevention and the WNY HIV/AIDS Public Health to promote proper disposal. They are responsible for placing over 20 kiosks in the Buffalo area.</li> <li>3. Erie County DOH is an Article 28 ESAP registered provider and since July 2007, as a response to a Hepatitis C breakout locally, the clinics are now furnishing syringes.</li> </ol>

<p><b>Centro Civico of Amsterdam</b> 143-145 East Main Street Amsterdam, NY 12010</p>	<p>1. Project Needle Smart promotes and coordinates a safe disposal program in the areas of Amsterdam and the Capital District. Through its efforts, the agency has placed kiosks in 10 pharmacies and two CBOs including their own agency. 2. The program has created an animated TV commercial starring "Freddy the Frog" to promote safe disposal.</p>

CPHE has been responsible in placing kiosks at 10 health centers throughout Suffolk and Nassau Counties. 2. CPHE provides training to health center staff on the proper disposal of used syringes 3. CPHE surveys local pharmacies in the surrounding communities near the health centers regarding ESAP participation and provides educational and marketing material for syringe disposal at local health centers 4. CPHE developed a user friendly brochure on the importance of proper syringe disposal and safe methods of disposal. Plans are underway to translate the brochure on Spanish.</p>

In partnership with the NYSDOH Clinical Education Initiative, the CNY Syringe Disposal Coalition provides educational tool kits that include health education materials detailing ESAP's syringe access and proper disposal, as well as syringe drop-off sites to pharmacies in the CNY area. 2. The Coalition provides CNY-based ESAP brochures listing pharmacy participants and syringe drop-off sites to CBOs who will in turn impart the information to the community at large. 3. Distribution of fitpacks takes place at CBOs. 4. Coalition attempts to recruit new members including pharmacists, physicians and community leaders on a regular basis.</p>

Through the New York State Safe Sharps Collection Program, the Allegany County Department of Public Works has initiated the new Think Sharp – Safe Syringe Disposal Program. 2. A program brochure has been created. 3. They have registered four of their seven solid waste disposal facilities to be official safe disposal sites for home generated sharps with sharps disposal kiosks drop boxes. 4. The program not only collects used sharps for proper disposal, but provides the public with proper disposal education and free individual sharps containers at all of their seven solid waste sites. 5. The Public Works Department has partnered with local pharmacies (10) who have agreed to help promote the program, advertise the 4 new disposal locations, and also provide residents with free sharps disposal containers (fitpacks and/or 1 qt. red sharps containers). 6. All free sharps containers provided to the public include an attached label and brochure describing the project and the new proper disposal locations. 7. <b>Sharps Drop Box Locations:</b>     a.
