

In accordance with Section 3334 of the Public Health Law and Sections 80.67, 80.68 and 80.69 of the Part 80 Rules and Regulations on Controlled Substances in New York State, a practitioner must provide to the pharmacist an Official New York State Prescription after:

- ✓ **Authorizing an emergency oral prescription for a Schedule II or benzodiazepine controlled substance; OR**
- ✓ **Faxing a controlled substance prescription to a pharmacy for a patient in a hospice program or Residential Health Care Facility (RHCF) which has a written agreement or contract with the dispensing pharmacy, or for compounding for direct parenteral administration.**

If the pharmacist fails to receive such prescription, he/she is required to notify the New York State Department of Health's Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement in writing within seven days from the date of dispensing the controlled substance. This form should be used by the pharmacist for such notification.
