

Guide to Edits for Health Home Redesignation Policy

Summary: As of February 2024 (retroactive to August 1, 2023), the Health Home Redesignation policy [[Health Home Redesignation Policy #HH0014](#)] guidelines will now reflect a newly weighted scoring system, adjusted aggregate score ranges for Redesignation length, and modified timelines to submit a Request for Redesignation and the Enhanced Oversight Plan (EOP). The revised Health Home Redesignation Policy HH0014, supersedes previous policy. This Guide to Edits outlines the changes and new additions made to this policy.

5- Section Three: 6-month Provisional Redesignation	New language regarding restriction of certain activities while a Health Home is in provisional status.	While in a 6-month or 1-year provisional status, it is expected that Health Home will focus their efforts on solidifying their core functions through the corrective action process. Therefore, during this time a Health Home must refrain from adding any new CMAs to its network. Additionally, requests for population expansion or county expansions of any kind will not be approved and any requests actively under review and consideration by the Department will be suspended. Once a Health Home is deemed in good standing by the Department, these restrictions will be lifted.	New

6- Section Three: Enhanced Oversight Plan	The chart review finds score have been adjusted.	The Department will require Health Homes with a total aggregate score of 70% and above to complete and submit a written Enhanced Oversight Plan (EOP), for any Domain elements marked "Not Met" by the Department, and any chart review findings of less than 90% 89% . 6- Section Three: Enhanced Oversight Plan	The EOP submission timeline has been adjusted from four weeks to 14 calendar days along with clarifying language for submission.	The Health Home must complete and submit their EOP to the Department within four weeks of receipt of their total aggregate score. NOTE: if a Health Home submits a request for Domain 3 reconsideration, the four week period begins at the time of receipt of Department's final decision. 14 calendar days of either receiving their <i>total aggregate score</i> or, if the Health Home submits a Request for Reconsideration, upon the Department's final decision.
