

DISASTER RECOVERY CENTERS

For those in areas hard-hit by recent storms, Disaster Recovery Centers are open. The centers are administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and staffed by federal and state agencies and organizations such as the Red Cross. At the centers, personnel can answer many questions you may have about the recovery process and provide helpful information.

Centers are currently open seven days a week during the hours listed at these locations:

Rockland County

Suffolk County

Lindenhurst – Lindenhurst Library, 1 Lee Avenue, 9 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Mastic – Mastic Recreation Community Center, 15 Herkimer Street, 9 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Riverhead -- Riverhead Community Center, 300 Center Drive, 7 a.m. – 7 p.m.

Westchester County

White Plains – County Center, 198 Central Avenue, 8 a.m. – 8 p.m.

New York City

Brooklyn – IKEA, 1 Beard Street, 9:30 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Far Rockaway – Community Church of the Nazarene, 1414 Central Avenue, 8 a.m. – 8 p.m.

Staten Island – Mount Manresa Jesuit House, 239 Fingerboard Road, 8 a.m. – 8 p.m.
