**FFY 2022 DWSRF Intended Use Plan Amendment:**

On September 24, 2014 the New York State Department of Health (DOH) received a Federal Disaster Relief Appropriations Act (DRAA) Capitalization Grant to fund public drinking water infrastructure projects for resiliency and mitigation against future climate events. This grant has a remaining unobligated balance of \$9,732,727.90, which will expire if not obligated by September 30, 2022. To avoid the loss of these funds, the DOH is issuing this notice indicating that a modification will be implemented to utilize these DRAA funds in place of DWSRF base funds for the loan portion of the following resiliency project:

DWSRF Project No. 18582: Village of Mount Kisco, Westchester County – NYS Route 117 Distribution System Upgrades. This project is also added to the Annual List with a project cost of \$10,500,000, a score of 15, and a population of 9,600. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in previous intended use plans, it is intended that available DRAA funds for this project will be provided as an interest free loan.

The New York State Department of Health has determined that the amendment is necessary, reasonable, and in the interest of protecting public health. The amendment will not adversely affect any project on the IUP Project Annual List above the subsidized funding line. Except as noted above, there are no other changes to the IUP as a result of this Amendment No. 5 of the FFY 2022 IUP
