(Document B) The staff recommended a 1:3 nurse-to-patient ratio while management</p>	<p>since December 2021 with a committee comprised of labor and management as indicated in the NYS DOH clinical staffing committee guidelines we have agreed to the staffing plans associated with all our clinical areas with the exception of the Intermediate Care Units (ICRs).</p> <p>The management team is recommending a 1:4 ratio (1 RN to 4 patients) for Intermediate Care Rooms (ICR). The staff team is requesting a 1:3 RN ratio. The management team's rationale for the 1:4 nurse-to-patient ratio is detailed below:</p> <p>1. The ICR units provide a continuum of care. Patients are admitted and discharged directly to and</p>	<p>Intermediate Care Unit can be found to support both 1:3 and 1:4 ratios. Stony Brook University Hospital is Level One Trauma Center and has the sickest patients in all of Suffolk County. The acuity of the patients in the Intermediate Care Units is higher than most of the other acute care facilities on Long Island. The intermediate Care Units are often comparable to Intensive Care Units in Level 2 and Level 3 Trauma centers. For the past several months, we have had an increase in the Protest of Assignment Forms that discuss safety concerns, patient care, and unsafe ratios. Nurses have been given assignments with the suggested ratios of 1:4 and sometimes 1:5. Nurses have deemed both ratios to be inappropriate. On a regular</p>
