What is a Minority Area?

Public Health Law §240(2) defines a Minority Area as:

“...a county with a non-white population of forty percent, or more, or the service area of an agency, corporation, facility or individual providing medical and/or health services whose non-white population is forty percent or more.”



What is a Minor Civil Division?

The US Census Bureau defines a Minor Civil Division as:

“A type of governmental unit that is the primary governmental or administrative division of a county or statistically equivalent entity in 29 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Island Areas. MCDs are represented by several types of legal entities, such as townships, towns (in eight states), and districts.”

What Do We Know? – General Trends


- 64% of Minority Areas in the report(s) have a higher percentage of premature deaths than all of NYS, 75% higher than NYS (excluding NYC), and 79% higher than the county within which they reside; and
- 72% of Minority Areas in the report(s) have a higher age-adjusted ratio of heart attack hospitalizations than the NYS total; 54% higher than NYS excluding NYC; and 72% higher than the county in which they reside.

Just over half of the Minority Areas in the report(s) [54%] have a higher age-adjusted suicide rate than NYS (excluding NYC).

Minority population density map by census block group, 2010-2014












Prevent HIV/STDs, Vaccine Preventable Diseases and Healthcare-Associated Infections




