What Happened in 2023?

- In May 2023, Medicaid coverage for doula services was included in the enacted state budget.
- NYS Medicaid hosted nine Doula Service Town Hall Meetings from May through December to receive public input on statewide benefit design and implementation, and to educate stakeholders on the State Plan Amendment process.
- Town Halls included stakeholder dialogue and presentations by two Medicaid Managed Care health plans, Erie County pilot doulas, and the NYS DOH Office of Quality and Patient Safety.



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2023, Continued

Using stakeholder input and feedback for the proposed State Plan Amendment, NYS Medicaid:

- Defined two distinct pathways (training and work experience) to qualify for enrollment as a NYS Medicaid doula services provider;
- Defined competencies and minimum qualifications for both NYS Medicaid enrollment pathways;
- Defined revalidation requirements for all Medicaid doula providers;
- Determined doula services visit coverage, per visit reimbursement rate, and percent of reimbursement per visit type



Additional Progress

Federal Public Notice (FPN):

- The FPN, which is part of the State Plan Amendment (SPA) process and allows for public feedback on the proposed SPA, was published on 12/13/2023.
- Formal public comment can be submitted between 12/13/2023 and federal approval.

State Plan Amendment (SPA):

- The proposed SPA received Department of Budget/Chamber approval on 12/28/2023.
- The proposed SPA was advanced for federal approval to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) on 12/28/2023.

- Statewide Medicaid coverage of doula services is pending CMS approval of the SPA.



What Happens Now?

- Statewide Medicaid coverage of doula services is pending CMS approval of the submitted SPA.
- NYS Medicaid is preparing for doula provider enrollment and publication of the Medicaid Doula Services Provider Manual.
- NYS Medicaid will continue to host Town Halls to update on the statewide implementation process and seek input where possible.
- Once NYS Medicaid receives federal approval, a Medicaid Update article will be released to announce benefit details.



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What Can Doulas Do Now?

Apply for a National Provider Identifier (NPI):

- All NYS Medicaid-enrolled providers are required to have an NPI.
- Doulas that do not yet have a NPI are encouraged to apply for one now.

Enrollment Preparation: Stakeholder Engagement

- Doula stakeholders are invited to provide input and feedback regarding Medicaid doula provider enrollment.
- Two virtual, one-hour meetings will be offered, and stakeholders are invited to attend one of these meetings.
- Each meeting will be limited to 15-20 participants.
- Meetings are on <u>Friday, January 12 from 1-2pm</u> and <u>Wednesday, January 17 from 12-1pm</u>.

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Pilot Information: Medicaid Doula Enrollment Extension and Revalidation

- All doulas who are currently enrolled in New York State Medicaid via the Doula Services Pilot will remain enrolled through 2/28/2025.
- To revalidate on or before 2/28/2025, doulas who are currently enrolled in New York State Medicaid via the Doula Services Pilot will need to follow updated revalidation requirements according to statewide guidelines.
- Updated revalidation requirements will be published upon implementation of statewide Medicaid coverage of doula services.

Pilot Information: Medicaid Doula Pilot Transition to Statewide Medicaid Coverage of Doula Services

- The piloted coverage of doula services in Erie County will end on 2/29/2024.
- As of 3/1/2024, <u>all</u> Medicaid doula services provided by Medicaid-enrolled doulas in Erie County will be reimbursed using new billing codes at the updated reimbursement rates.
- Upon federal approval and statewide implementation, an updated provider manual and billing guidance will be published, to include new billing codes and rates.
- All Medicaid-enrolled doulas are to follow updated guidelines, including those doulas who participated in the doula services pilot.

- Doula directory will align with legislative requirements.

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§ 2594-a. Definitions. 1. For the purposes of this title, "doula" means a trained person who provides continuous physical, emotional, and informational support to a pregnant person and the family of such pregnant person before, during or a reasonable time after childbirth.

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2. A doula may provide services in hospitals, birthing centers, at home deliveries and other community settings.

§ 2594-b. New York state community doula directory. 1. The department shall establish and maintain a community doula directory for doulas on the department's internet website for the purposes of Medicaid reimbursement and promoting doula services to Medicaid recipients.

2. The directory shall include the following information concerning 12 doulas such as:

(a) the name of the doula who provides doula services;

14 (b) the address and location of where the doula provides doula 15 services:

(c) the name of each Medicaid provider that employs or contracts with a doula to provide doula services to eligible Medicaid recipients;

(d) the doula's national provider identification number, if applica-18 19 ble; and

20 (e) all documentation of criteria pursuant to section twenty-five 21 hundred ninety-four-c of this title.

3. The department shall determine the method of registration and the 22 23 documentation required to verify such criteria has been met.

4. Each doula shall be responsible for completing the requirements 25 pursuant to section twenty-five hundred ninety-four-c of this title.

26 5. The department shall not impose any fee on any doula to register 27 for admittance into the New York state community doula directory.

28 6. The community doula directory shall be publicly accessible at no 29 cost to the doula or birthing person looking to hire a doula in their community. 30

31 § 2594-c. Criteria for admittance into the New York state community 32 doula directory. 1. Each doula seeking Medicaid reimbursement shall

apply to be registered in the New York state community doula directory.

2. A doula shall submit to the department a certified copy of such doula's certification from a doula educational organization or by demon-

stration of satisfactory proficiency pursuant to this section, and his,

36 her, or their full name, address, phone number, email address, and if 37

38 applicable, their national provider identification number.

39 \$ 3. This act shall take effect nine months after it shall have become 40 a law.



Proposed NYS Medicaid Doula Competencies for <u>Training Pathway</u> to Meeting Criteria for Enrollment

Core Competencies (20 Hours of Training):

- Foundations on anatomy of pregnancy and childbirth
- Labor support techniques and nonmedical comfort measures
- Common medical interventions: risks, benefits, and decision-making
- Prenatal and postpartum education and support
- Lactation support, education and infant feeding
- Scope of practice

Broader Competencies (Four Hours of Training):

- Cultural awareness/humility and cross-cultural communication
- Health equity in medical field, especially reproductive health
- Person-centered and trauma-informed care
- Community-based knowledge and facilitating connection to resources



Proposed Fee for Service Reimbursement Structure

Service	Visit Allowance	Per Visit Reimbursement	Percent of Total Reimbursement	Amount of Total Reimbursement
Perinatal Service: Prenatal or postpartum doula support	8 visits	NYC: \$93.75 ROS: \$84.37	50%	NYC: Up to \$750 ROS: Up to \$675
Labor and Delivery: In-person doula support during labor and birth	1 encounter	NYC: \$750 ROS: \$675	50%	NYC: \$750 ROS: \$675

MMC Plans are encouraged to match or exceed the FFS rate
