Stakeholder Feedback: Provider Enrollment

- NYS Medicaid hosted two one-hour, virtual sessions in January 2024
- 22 stakeholders attended
- Stakeholders provided:
 - Feedback to improve the doula services enrollment process, and
 - Perspectives about strengths, weaknesses, and suggestions of materials
- Items reviewed included:
 - Erie County Doula Pilot enrollment materials,
 - Pilot enrollment supports, and
 - Drafted statewide provider enrollment materials.
- NYS Medicaid thanks all participants for their time and has incorporated feedback into the drafted documents.
- Medicaid Provider enrollment documents are in the process of being finalized and will be published when provider enrollment opens.

Doula Directory

- Signed legislation to establish NYS Medicaid doula directory
- Legislation link: <u>https://www.nysenate.gov/legislation/bills/</u> 2023/A5435/amendment/A
- Current pilot directory link: <u>https://www.health.ny.gov/health_care/me_dicaid/redesign/doulapilot/index.htm</u>
- Doula directory will align with legislative requirements.
- Drafted electronic form and directory are being shared in this meeting for feedback.
- Directory will need to be built and maintained within the limitations and requirements of the DOH public website.

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- § 2594-a. Definitions. 1. For the purposes of this title, "doula" means a trained person who provides continuous physical, emotional, and informational support to a pregnant person and the family of such pregnant person before, during or a reasonable time after childbirth.
- A doula may provide services in hospitals, birthing centers, at home deliveries and other community settings.
- § 2594-b. New York state community doula directory. 1. The department shall establish and maintain a community doula directory for doulas on the department's internet website for the purposes of Medicaid reimbursement and promoting doula services to Medicaid recipients.
- 11 2. The directory shall include the following information concerning doular such as:
 - (a) the name of the doula who provides doula services;
- 14 (b) the address and location of where the doula provides doula 15 services:
 - (c) the name of each Medicaid provider that employs or contracts with a doula to provide doula services to eligible Medicaid recipients;
 - (d) the doula's national provider identification number, if applicable; and
 - (e) all documentation of criteria pursuant to section twenty-five hundred ninety-four-c of this title.
 - 3. The department shall determine the method of registration and the documentation required to verify such criteria has been met.
 - 4. Each doula shall be responsible for completing the requirements pursuant to section twenty-five hundred ninety-four-c of this title.
 - 5. The department shall not impose any fee on any doula to register for admittance into the New York state community doula directory.
 - 6. The community doula directory shall be publicly accessible at no cost to the doula or birthing person looking to hire a doula in their community.
 - § 2594-c. Criteria for admittance into the New York state community doula directory. 1. Each doula seeking Medicaid reimbursement shall apply to be registered in the New York state community doula directory.
 - 2. A doula shall submit to the department a certified copy of such doula's certification from a doula educational organization or by demonstration of satisfactory proficiency pursuant to this section, and his, her, or their full name, address, phone number, email address, and if applicable, their national provider identification number.
- § 3. This act shall take effect nine months after it shall have become 40 a law.



Review: Pilot Information: Medicaid Doula Enrollment Extension and Revalidation

- All doulas who are currently enrolled as New York State Medicaid providers via the Doula Services Pilot will remain enrolled through 2/28/2025.
- To revalidate on or before 2/28/2025, doulas who are currently enrolled in New York State Medicaid via the Doula Services Pilot will need to follow updated revalidation requirements according to statewide guidelines.
- Updated revalidation requirements will be published upon implementation of statewide Medicaid coverage of doula services.

Review: Pilot Information: Medicaid Doula Pilot Transition to Statewide Medicaid Coverage of Doula Services

- The piloted coverage of doula services in Erie County will end on 2/29/2024.
- As of 3/1/2024, <u>all</u> Medicaid doula services provided by Medicaid-enrolled doulas in Erie County will be reimbursed under the statewide benefit and updated billing codes and reimbursement rates will apply. Claims for services provided on and after 3/1/24 may be submitted after statewide coverage has been announced (this will occur after the SPA has been approved and updated guidance has been published).
- Upon federal approval and statewide implementation, an updated provider manual and billing guidance will be published, to include new billing codes and rates.
- All Medicaid-enrolled doulas are to follow updated guidelines, including those doulas who participated in the doula services pilot.

What Can Doulas Do Now?

Apply for a National Provider Identifier (NPI):

- All NYS Medicaid-enrolled providers are required to have an NPI.
- Doulas that do not yet have a NPI are encouraged to apply for one now.

Proposed Training and Work Experience Pathways

Training Pathway

- 24-hour minimum training in all required competencies
- Doula support provided at a minimum of three births

OR

Work Experience Pathway

- 30 births or 1000 hours of doula experience within the last 10 years
- Testimonials of doula skills in prenatal, labor and postpartum care

Both Pathways

- Basic HIPAA training
- Adult/Infant CPR
- Age 18 or older
- Liability Insurance
- Encouraged to take mandated reporter training and review OCFS resources

Both Pathways: Revalidation

Attestation to completion of continuing education in required competencies and CPR requirements

Proposed NYS Medicaid Doula Competencies for Training Pathway to Meeting Criteria for Enrollment

Core Competencies (20 Hours of Training):

- Foundations on anatomy of pregnancy and childbirth
- Labor support techniques and nonmedical comfort measures
- Common medical interventions: risks, benefits, and decision-making
- Prenatal and postpartum education and support
- Lactation support, education and infant feeding
- Scope of practice

Broader Competencies (Four Hours of Training):

- Cultural awareness/humility and cross-cultural communication
- Health equity in medical field, especially reproductive health
- Person-centered and trauma-informed care
- Community-based knowledge and facilitating connection to resources



Proposed Fee for Service Reimbursement Structure
