Enrollment Updates

 As of 3/1/2024, doulas can enroll to become NYS Medicaid Doula Services Providers.

- Applications received on or prior to 5/01/2024, in most cases, can be backdated to 3/1/2024.

Preparing for NYS Medicaid Enrollment and Billing

- Apply for a National Provider Identifier (NPI) to begin provider enrollment process.

Doula Directory

The NYS Medicaid Doula Directory is now live: https://www.health.ny.gov/health_care/medicaid/program/doula/directory/directory.htm

- This is a directory of all NYS Medicaid Fee-for-Service Doula Services Providers.
- Doulas are required to complete the directory form electronically as part of the provider enrollment process and to update information as needed.
- A doula will be added to the doula directory once their provider enrollment application has been approved.



Language Translation

• The NYSDOH Doula Services Website and Medicaid Doula Directory will be available in Spanish.

• The Client Recommendation Form used for enrollment with the Work Experience Pathway will be translated into multiple languages.



Recommendation for Doula Services

- Doula services with NYS Medicaid will be classified as a preventative service.
- As such, a recommendation by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts is required for each Medicaid Member.
- A request for a standing recommendation (order) for doula services from the NYS Commissioner of Health is pending. The issuance of this will eliminate the need for an individual recommendation for services for each Medicaid member.
- Regulatory amendment is needed for the Commissioner to be able to issue the standing order; this is being done in tandem with the State Budget process.
- In the interim, on and after 3/1/2024, NYS Medicaid-enrolled doulas, must obtain a written recommendation from a licensed provider for doula services for each Medicaid Member to whom they provide services.



Recommendation For Doula Services

- This recommendation must be dated prior to the initiation of doula services.
- Doulas must maintain a copy of each recommendation in their records.
- This recommendation can be completed using the <u>form</u> provided by the NYSDOH. It is not necessary to use the NYSDOH form as long as the NYS licensed practitioner's written recommendation for doula services includes the following:
 - Medicaid Member's first and last name:
 - Medicaid Member's date of birth;
 - Licensed practitioner's first and last name;
 - Licensed practitioner's license number;
 - Date of recommendation; and
 - Licensed practitioner's signature.



NYS Medicaid Doula Services Recommendation Form



If you are a Medicaid Member...

Doulas provide physical, emotional, educational, and non-medical support for pregnant and postpartum persons before, during, and after childbirth or end of pregnancy. You are eligible for doula services through NYS Medicald during pregnancy and up to 12 months after pregnancy, regardless of the outcome.

You must obtain a recommendation prior to the Initiation of doula services for the services to be covered by Medicald. This recommendation must be from a licensed practitioner*, for example, your primary care provider, OBGYN, midwife, or nurse. You can ask for a recommendation even if you do not know who your doula will be yet.



if you are a doula enrolled in NYS Medicaid

The doula must obtain a written record of the licensed practitioner's recommendation for the Medicaid Member prior to the Initiation of doula services for the services to be reimbursed by Medicaid. The doula must maintain this recommendation in their documentation records for the Medicaid Member in compilance with HIPAA standards.



if you are a licensed practitioner*...

This recommendation acknowledges that the Medicald member would benefit from doula support for the duration of the pregnancy and up until 12 months postpartum. A recommendation is not the same as a prescription or referral. You may provide a recommendation without identifying the doula who will serve the member.

This form can be used and is one example of a recommendation for douts services. Alternate documentation can be used as long as all of the information below is included to document a licensed practitioner's recommendation. This documentation must be kept by the Medicaid-enrolled douts services provider.

"Double services are a preventative health service and must be recommended by a physician or other licensed practitioner of the healing arts acting within their scope of practice under State law to be eligible for Medicald relimbursement. The licensed practitioner may include a physician, nurse practitioner, licensed midwife, psychologist, licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage family therapist, licensed mental health counseior or psychiatrist.



Doula Services Provider Manual

- The provider manual provides an overview of the doula services benefit, including
 - Provider guidelines and resources,
 - Enrollment and revalidation requirements,
 - Description of covered services, and
 - Documentation guidance.
- Billing codes have been removed from the version that is being shared today.
- Once NYS has received federal approval, the complete provider manual with billing codes and the fee schedule, will be published.
- The pilot provider manual will be replaced with the new manual.
- All Medicaid-enrolled doulas are to follow updated guidelines, including those doulas who participated in the doula services pilot.



Review: Medicaid Doula Pilot Transition to Statewide Medicaid Coverage of Doula Services

- The piloted coverage of doula services in Erie County ended on 2/29/2024.
- As of 3/1/2024, <u>all</u> Medicaid doula services provided by Medicaid-enrolled will be reimbursed under the statewide benefit. Updated billing codes and reimbursement rates will apply.
- Claims for services provided on and after 3/1/24 may be submitted after statewide coverage has been announced (this will occur after the SPA has been approved and updated guidance has been published).
- Upon federal approval and statewide implementation, an updated provider manual and billing guidance will be published, to include new billing codes and rates.
- All Medicaid-enrolled doulas are to follow updated guidelines, including those doulas who
 participated in the doula services pilot.

Proposed Training and Work Experience Pathways

Training Pathway

- 24-hour minimum training in all required competencies
- Doula support provided at a minimum of three births

OR

Work Experience Pathway

- 30 births or 1000 hours of doula experience within the last 10 years
- Testimonials of doula skills in prenatal, labor and postpartum care

Both Pathways

- NPI Number
- Age 18 or older
- Current adult and infant CPR certification
- Current liability insurance
- NYS Medicaid Feefor-Service Doula Directory
- Review and comply with HIPAA

Both Pathways: Revalidation

Attestation to completion of continuing education requirements, current CPR certification and liability coverage

Proposed NYS Medicaid Doula Competencies for Training Pathway to Meeting Criteria for Enrollment

Core Competencies (20 Hours of Training):

- Foundations on anatomy of pregnancy and childbirth
- Labor support techniques and nonmedical comfort measures
- Common medical interventions: risks, benefits, and decision-making
- Prenatal and postpartum education and support
- Lactation support, education and infant feeding
- Scope of practice

Broader Competencies (Four Hours of Training):

- Cultural awareness/humility and cross-cultural communication
- Health equity in medical field, especially reproductive health
- Person-centered and trauma-informed care
- Community-based knowledge and facilitating connection to resources



Proposed Fee for Service Reimbursement Structure

Service	Visit Allowance	Per Visit Reimbursement	Percent of Total Reimbursement	Amount of Total Reimbursement
Perinatal Service: Prenatal or postpartum doula support	8 visits	NYC: \$93.75 ROS: \$84.37	50%	NYC: Up to \$750 ROS: Up to \$675
Labor and Delivery: In-person doula support during labor and birth	1 encounter	NYC: \$750 ROS: \$675	50%	NYC: \$750 ROS: \$675

MMC Plans are encouraged to match or exceed the FFS rate



Review: Pilot Information: Medicaid Doula Enrollment Extension and Revalidation

- All doulas who are currently enrolled as New York State Medicaid providers via the Doula Services Pilot will remain enrolled through 2/28/2025.
- To revalidate on or before 2/28/2025, doulas who are currently enrolled in New York State Medicaid via the Doula Services Pilot will need to follow updated revalidation requirements according to statewide guidelines.
- Updated revalidation requirements will be published upon implementation of statewide Medicaid coverage of doula services.
