Comprehensive Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention (CAPP)
Community-Based Initiative**

Adolescent sexual health is a significant public health issue facing New York State today. The pregnancy rates have declined 43% from a high in 1993, yet they are still unacceptably high with 54.2 out of every 1000, 15 to 19-year-old females becoming pregnant each year. The racial and ethnic disparities in adolescent sexual health outcomes remain a critical issue with pregnancy and sexually transmitted disease (STD) rates consistently almost three times higher for black and Hispanic teens than for white teens. Adolescent pregnancy and birth rates by region demonstrate the continued trend of higher pregnancy and birth rates in New York City and in specific upstate communities. Pregnancy at too early an age interrupts and disrupts normal adolescent development and often results in significant academic, social and economic loss for the mother, father and child.

Purpose

To expand primary prevention efforts aimed at decreasing the incidence of adolescent pregnancy, reducing the risk of initial and repeat pregnancies, STDs and HIV/AIDS rates among adolescents. And, to more effectively address the racial, ethnic, and geographic disparities that are related to adolescent sexual health outcomes as well as the social and fiscal issues associated with adolescent parenting.

Background

CAPP established January 1, 2011, is focused on the promotion of sexual health among male and female eligible adolescents, 10 to 21 years of age through local community projects.

CAPP projects are located in targeted high-need areas that have been identified based on an Adolescent Sexual Health Needs Index (ASHNI). The ASHNI incorporates individual, family and community antecedents related to poor sexual health outcomes.

The initiative incorporates many of the expert recommendations from the symposium NYSDOH held in 2009 that was focused on adolescent sexual health, as well as input from 27 statewide youth focus groups. Project Goals

- Provide comprehensive, age appropriate, evidence-based, and medically accurate sexuality education to promote healthy sexual behaviors including abstinence, delay the onset of sexual activity and reduce the practice of risky sexual behaviors among youth.
- Ensure access to comprehensive reproductive healthcare and family planning services for adolescents.
- Expand opportunities and provide support and alternatives to sexual activity for adolescents, including pregnant and parenting teens, in order to promote an optimal transition through adolescent developmental milestones into a healthy young adulthood.
- Advance a comprehensive and sustainable local community effort to improve the community environment for adolescents through the development of a coordinated community plan.

An optional technology component is incorporated for family planning service providers to maximize the use of information communication technologies that are appropriate and consistent with current adolescent modes of communication. The efforts are focused on improving reproductive and family planning service delivery and decrease barriers for adolescents.

Family Planning Program

The purpose of the Family Planning program is to provide low income, uninsured women with contraceptive education, counseling and methods to assist them in determining their reproductive futures and avoiding unintended pregnancy. The New York State Family Planning Program provides comprehensive reproductive health care to low income women and adolescents in the state. The State has funded this program since the 1970's to make these services accessible and to work towards:

- Reducing unintended pregnancies and the need for abortions
- Curbing the spread of sexually transmitted diseases and HIV
- Improving birth outcomes
- Facilitating early detection and treatment of breast and cervical cancers
- Offer basic primary care preventive and treatment services to low income women who would otherwise be unable to obtain care.
- Provide counseling and testing for HIV and sexually transmitted diseases to help contain major threats to public health.
- Ensure access to preventive and primary health services for women and their partners.
- Provide health education in community settings, including schools to educate children about reproductive health; to prevent adolescent pregnancy by promoting abstinence, and to promote access to reproductive and preventive health services.

The Rape Crisis Sexual Violence Prevention Program (RCSVPP)

Since 1982, the NYSDOH has supported efforts intended to reduce the incidence of rape and sexual assault and to provide direct services to victims of rape and sexual assault. RCSVPP works to improve NYS's efforts relative to sexual assault prevention and to survivors through two centers of excellence and a statewide network of community based organizations.

The goal of the RCSVPP network is to improve societal response to rape, provide supports and services to victims of rape and sexual assault, and to promote primary prevention efforts that reduce the incidence of rape, victimization and sexual violence through education and community mobilization.

The specific activities of the DOH funded RCSVPP local community based organizations are to:

- Operate and respond to a 24-hour hotline.
- Provide short-term counseling sessions and support services to victims of rape and sexual assault.
- Provide advocacy services to address the needs and rights of the survivor.
- Accompany survivors to medical and legal appointments.
- Provide age-appropriate, sexual violence prevention education programs in schools, colleges and community locations.
- Provide professional trainings for law enforcement officers, school personnel, social workers, district attorneys and physicians.
- Advance community mobilization efforts through the development of local coalitions to influence factors that lead to sexual violence.

Community Health Worker Program (CHWP)

CHWP is a paraprofessional home visiting program developed and administered by the Department of Health. The program has been in existence for over 20 years and currently operates in 23 sites throughout NYS targeted to communities with high rates of infant mortality, low-birth weight, preterm delivery, births to teenage mothers, and poverty. The program prioritizes services to women with late or no prenatal care and/or poor compliance with prenatal care and focuses on getting Medicaid-eligible pregnant women into early and consistent prenatal care and ensuring families receive primary and preventive health care services.

Services are provided by trained paraprofessional Community Health Workers (CHWs) who live in or are familiar with the community, creating a bridge between providers of health, social and community services and the underserved and hard-to-reach populations within the community. CHWs are trained to provide basic health education and referrals for a wide range of services and to provide support and assistance in navigating the services system. CHWs provide outreach, education and monthly home visits during pregnancy and through the baby's first year of life. The ultimate goal is to assist families to develop the necessary skills and resources to improve their health status and family functioning in order to move towards self-sufficiency. CHWs are supervised by a nurse or social worker with clinical case management experience.

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Urban Health Plan

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Nurse Family Partnership (NFP)

NFP is a national, evidence-based nurse home visiting program for at-risk first-time mothers, their infants, and families. Home visits are conducted by trained registered nurses on average two times per month during pregnancy and until the infant's second birthday. Nurses carry a caseload of no more than 25 families.

The program helps families improve maternal and child health, build a secure and nurturing relationship between parent and child, and reach education and employment goals. With each visit, nurses focus on personal health, environmental health, quality of care-giving for the child, maternal life-course development, social networks, and health and human service utilization.

The goal of the Healthy Mom - Healthy Baby Prenatal and Postpartum Home Visiting program is to improve the health of Medicaid-eligible mothers and infants through early identification, outreach, referral, and home visiting to high risk pregnant women and newborns. The Healthy Mom - Healthy Baby Prenatal and Postpartum Home Visiting program is an organized county system of perinatal health and home visiting services to identify high-risk pregnant women early in their pregnancies and postpartum women and their newborns soon after birth, assess their need for health care and social services, and help them obtain appropriate services.

Healthy Families New York (HFNY)

HFNY is an evidence-based, paraprofessional home visiting program that targets expectant parents and parents with infants less than 3 months of age considered at high-risk for child abuse and neglect. HFNY is directed by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services. The program prioritizes services to low income, single parents with a history of child abuse/child welfare services, substance abuse, late/no prenatal care, mental issues, and domestic violence.

HFNY promotes the use of positive parenting skills that support and encourage children's cognitive and social development, links families to a medical provider, and refers families to additional services based on identified needs. Home visits are conducted by trained paraprofessionals who are reflective of the communities they serve. HFNY staff receives required training according to HFA standards. Home visitors provide families with support, education and linkages to community services with the goals of promoting positive parenting skills and parent-child interaction, preventing child abuse and neglect, ensuring optimal prenatal care and child health and development, and increasing parents' self sufficiency.

Home visits are conducted biweekly during pregnancy and weekly during the first six months of the child's life. As families progress through the program, the frequency of home visits declines from biweekly, to monthly, to quarterly. Families are offered home visiting services until the child is in school or a Head Start program.
