

**INCOME**

**MEDICALLY NEEDY INCOME LEVEL**

**Policy:**

The medically needy income level is used to determine eligibility for all categories except S/CC and LIF. (See page 121 for Public Assistance Standard of Need.) In addition, pregnant women and children may be eligible under one of the poverty levels.

The medically needy income levels according to family size are:

**Interpretation:**

Determine the A/R's household size and net available monthly income in accordance with the A/R's category. For A/Rs who are ADC-related, SSI-related, under 21, pregnant, stepparents, and/or fathers of unborns with no children of their own in the household the net available income is compared to the medically needy income level or the PA Standard of Need (see page 121), whichever is higher.
