Lessons Learned Through the Lens: The EMS Photo Documentary Project

Peter M. Antevy, MD, *Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital, Hollywood, FL*

Dr. Antevy also has a degree in medical education and dedicates his time and efforts to enhancing the quality of pediatric emergency care amongst hospital and pre-hospital providers. Through innovative educational techniques and products, Dr. Antevy expands the boundaries of pediatric education and is determined to spread this knowledge to all healthcare providers who come into contact with critically ill children.

3:15pm Orthopedic Considerations in the PolyTrauma Patient

Musculoskeletal injuries are frequently encountered in patients sustaining polytrauma. Thorough prehospital and emergency department evaluation and appropriate management of the orthopedic patient is crucial for an optimal outcome. This lecture will provide the attendee with the fundamental knowledge base to handle situations ranging from long bone fractures to the orthopedic emergency. Physical examinations and pearls for splinting techniques will be addressed giving providers newfound confidence when handling orthopedic trauma.

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
