UNINSURED CARE PROGRAMS



If you or someone you know has HIV or is at risk of acquiring HIV, the New York State Department of Health's Uninsured Care Programs can help pay for medications, medical care and health insurance.

What is covered?

- ADAP (AIDS Drug Assistance Program) pays for medications used to treat HIV/AIDS.
- ADAP Plus (Primary Care) pays for medical visits and lab tests at enrolled clinics, hospitals, and private doctors' offices.
- HIV Home Care Program pays for home health care.
- APIC (ADAP Plus Insurance Continuation) pays the premium for cost-effective health insurance.
- PrEP-AP (Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis Assistance Program) pays for medical and lab testing associated with the use of Pre-exposure Prophylaxis medications to prevent HIV infection.

Who can apply?

People who live in New York State:

- who are HIV positive or at risk of acquiring HIV;
- · who meet certain income guidelines;
- · who are teens, unable to access health care coverage;
- who have insurance and need help paying for co-payments and deductibles;
- who need help paying premiums or Medicare Part D out-of-pocket costs.
