


Leading Causes of All Injury

Deaths, Hospitalizations and Emergency Department[†] (ED) Visits


Suffolk County, New York Residents, 2005-2007

Deaths




- Motor Vehicle Traffic Injuries are the leading cause for injury related death for Suffolk County residents.
- Annually, an average of 164 Suffolk County Residents die due to traffic related injuries.
 - 96 Occupants
 - 23 Pedestrians
 - 22 Motorcyclists
 - 17 Unspecified
 - 6 Pedal Cyclists

Hospitalizations



- Motor Vehicle Traffic Injuries are the second leading cause for injury related hospitalizations for Suffolk County residents.
- Annually, an average of 1,728 Suffolk County Residents are hospitalized due to traffic related injuries.
 - 1,200 Occupants
 - 190 Pedestrians
 - 188 Motorcyclists
 - 85 Unspecified Persons
 - 63 Pedal Cyclists
 - * Other

ED[†] Visits



- Motor Vehicle Traffic Injuries are the third leading cause for injury related outpatient ED[†] visits for Suffolk County residents.
- Annually, an average of 17,186 Suffolk County Residents are treated and released from an ED due to traffic related injuries.
 - 14,569 Occupants
 - 1,240 Unspecified Persons
 - 607 Pedestrians
 - 490 Motorcyclists
 - 272 Pedal Cyclists
 - 8 Other

[†]The incidence of ED visits does not include patients that were subsequently admitting into the hospital
